he Imaging & Interventional Techniques seminar, consisting of didactic presentations and interactive workshops, will provide a thorough understanding of the ultrasonic interpretation criteria used to define breast anatomy and recognise changes due to benign conditions and early breast cancers.

Imaging strategies for cancer detection will be reviewed and the use of needle biopsy techniques presented from the viewpoint of providing a definitive diagnosis. 
